Solving the problem

With one in nine Georgians facing hunger - and one in seven children - we can't afford to waste one crumb of food. Bagel Rescue aims to reduce food waste and support hunger relief, one bagel at a time by partnering with 60 local bakeries to "rescue" unsold bagels and donate them to neighbors in need.

Instead of filling landfills, we're filling bellies!

To date, Bagel Rescue has made more than 18,000 bagel deliveries totaling over 2.5 million bagels and counting. Each week our team of 250+ tenacious volunteers deliver to more than 150 partner agencies in nine counties of Metro Atlanta that work to combat food insecurity, including shelters, food pantries, youth programs, street outreach efforts, and more. We're feeding the environment too: our efforts have saved an equivalent amount of Co2 as 43k full grown trees in one year.

A bagel is more than just a bagel – It's nourishment, love, and a bite of dignity for those in need, especially those in underserved communities.

Bagel Rescue strives to solve problems facing our community by connecting causes in ways that truly make a difference to everyone involved. Our mission encompasses hunger relief, social justice, and the environmental impact of food waste.

Going from just a few deliveries a week in 2021 to over 150 has been an exciting and fast-paced journey. Our

grassroots approach is mighty and has resulted in an epic chain of goodness in Atlanta communities.

We are consistently upgrading our model for efficiency and sustainability to ensure we remain community and volunteer friendly. Our continued endeavors include:


- Add Regional Storage Hubs to our existing 12 locations to manage bagel logistics and capacity building.
- Expand to new markets through strategic partnerships adapted from our successful Atlanta model.
- Maintain & improve volunteer management systems to efficiently coordinate routes.
- Expand marketing efforts to recruit additional volunteers, food donors, and recipient partners.
- Educate the community on the causes Bagel Rescue represents and how to be part of the solution to these critical issues.
- Increase bagel packaging workshops that engage community groups that want to get involved in meaningful service activities.




Bagel Rescue by the Numbers - Growing by the Dozens

Bagel Rescue is a bridge that connects resources and people in powerful ways.

Hunger Relief – Weekly Stats

- We deliver to 150+ partner agencies.
- We feed approximately 25,000 people; at least one-third of them are children.
- We reach neighbors where they live in shelters, at local food pantries, in community youth & senior programs, and on the streets.
- Our outreach extends to 60+ neighborhoods in
 12 counties of metro Atlanta.
- We aim to be a food resource for all in need regardless of race, religion, nationality, sexual orientation, or gender identity.

Health & Wellbeing

- Food is a most basic need and no one can reach their potential without it.
- Nutrition impacts physical, cognitive, and emotional health.
- Those who experience hunger are more likely to suffer from chronic diseases.
- Sagel Rescue can take the stress of providing a meal off the shoulders of the families and individuals we support.
- Repurposing good food frees up funds to be spent on other resources to help those in need.

Environment

- Instead of filling landfills, we're filling bellies.
- Since our inception, Bagel Rescue has saved approximately 2 million lbs. of CO2 by keeping bagels out of landfills.
- That's the equivalent to the CO2 removed by 43k full grown trees in one year.

Education

Reducing waste and hunger, and working towards food equality takes awareness, resources, and passion. We teach students of all ages the value of this important work to make a difference in the world.

Food Justice

- Bagel Rescue pushes into communities with limited resources to deliver food where it is needed most.
- Food is a human right. No one can feel valued in the world if their basic needs are not met.
- Food insecurity disproportionately affects marginalized, underserved, and minority communities.
- Without access to food resources, the cycle of unfavorable outcomes continues.
